## C-809/18P MINERAL MAGIC

4. Conditions of Application, 4.5 Relationship between the marks and between the goods and services

4 sub-paragraphs:

- Article 8(3) applies beyond identical signs and G/S
- Assessment of similarity: taking into account the objective pursued by Article 8(3) EUTMR and in a combined assessment

4. Conditions of Application, 4.1.3 Territorial scope of the agreement between the agent and the principal

- Even if only a territory outside the European Union, Article 8(3) EUTMR may still apply.
